## Garbage Collection

Please place in the TRASH:

- Mixed trash
- Bagged garbage \& food waste
- Broken toys
- Styrofoam \& other loose trash
- Ceramics


## Recycling Collection Every Week

Please place in the RECYCLING:
(recycling may be placed in clear plastic bags):

## MIXED CONTAINERS/BAGS

- Aluminum cans \& clean aluminum foil
- Tin cans, steel cans, aerosol cans, empty/dried paint cans
- Glass bottles $\&$ jars
- \#1-7 plastic
- Milk cartons, juice boxes, soup cartons


## MIXED PAPER

- Newspaper, magazines, books, mail, school/office paper
- Brown corrugated cardboard
- Gray chipboard (cereal \& shoe boxes)
- Brown paper bags
- Shredded paper (bagged in clear plastic)

Local clean sweep programs may offer alternative options for disposal of fluorescent light bulbs, household hazardous waste, pharmaceuticals and electronics.

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## SERVICE REMINDERS

- The garbage container/bags should be placed within 2 ft . of the street on one side of the driveway.
- The recycle container/bags should be placed within 2 ft . of the street on the other side of the driveway.


## RECYCLING FACTS

Bottled water costs between $\$ 1$ and $\$ 4$ per gallon, and 90 percent of the cost is in the bottle, lid and label.

5 plastic bottles can be recycled to make a polyester T-shirt.

A used aluminum can is able to be recycled and back on the grocery shelf as a new can in as fast as 60 days.

Recycling one aluminum can saves enough energy to keep a 100-watt bulb burning for almost four hours, or run your television for three hours.

Reduce paper waste by using both sides of the paper and using scrap paper whenever possible.

Reuse canvas, paper or plastic bags to bring home purchases.

During the week with a holiday, if the normal collection falls on or after the holiday, your collection will be the next day, including Saturday.

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
